

PROCEEDINGS

OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, GRIGGS COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA. OFFICIAL PUBLICATION.

The Board met in regular session this 2nd day of July 1906. Present Commissioners Lucken, Nelson, Hadlock and Gunderson. Minutes of the preceding session were read and approved.

The bond of Otto Fritz, as Justice of the Peace, was by motion approved.

By motion the following bills were allowed:

Table listing various bills and amounts, including items like 'Oscar D. Furinton, postage', 'C. J. Lucken, 2 wheel scrapers for 2nd Dist \$80.00', 'Seval Friswold, Dist Court Jurors', 'Warrants \$100.00, Bailiff \$8.00', etc.

Table listing names and amounts for various officials and services, including 'J. D. Barclay, clerk', 'Eric Johnson, clerk', 'Jos. Ebentire, inspector', 'F. J. Westerhausen, judge', 'F. J. Kingley, clerk and returning ballot box', etc.

Table listing agricultural and property assessments, including 'National Bank of Hannaford raised 90 per cent', 'Bank Stock State Bank of Walum raised 15 per cent', 'Cooperstown, Horses 1 year reduced 20 per cent', etc.

Under Chap. 20, Revised Codes 1899, and We being satisfied that they have complied with the requirements of said law. Be it resolved that the territory embraced in said petition be and the same is hereby ordered, with the assent of the qualified voters who shall vote on said incorporation on the 21st day of July 1906, at Town Hall in said village of Hannaford, to be included within the corporate limits of the incorporated village of Hannaford. The Supt. of Schools appeared and refunded \$215, which by reason of the Supreme Court decisions of January 1905, appeared to have been drawn in error as salary during the years 1901 to 1905. By motion made, seconded and carried the amount was accepted. The bond of the Minneapolis Bridge and Iron Co., in the sum of \$1950, covering their contract with the county was duly approved. R. S. Blow was by motion awarded the contract for grading the approaches to the bridge which is to be built on section 15, town of Sverdrup. By motion the chairman was requested to appoint a committee of one to confer with the commissioners of Nelson County in regard to a road on the north side of section 5, Willow township. O. S. Gunderson was appointed, and the auditor was directed to advise the auditor of Nelson Co. By motion the surveyor was directed to survey the road which starts at the north end of 8th street, Village of Cooperstown running north through sections 24, 13 and 12 and to make report to Chairman Lucken. The Auditor was directed to advertise for bids for the work as specified by the chairman. By motion John Ebentire was appointed Inspector of Elections for the 2nd District.
