

Herbert G. Chamberlain died Sunday morning at his home in East China. The deceased was born March 26, 1861, in China and was the son of Calvin Chamberlain, who died about 35 years ago, and a grandson of those early pioneers, Porter Chamberlain and Lovicia Worden Chamberlain who came from New York to this section in 1829. He was married in December 1885 to Miss Nettie Morton of Bay City. One son was born to them who died in infancy. He has, however, in addition to the widow, a sister, Mrs. Andrew Husel, jr., living in China. He also leaves numerous more remote relatives and a host of friends to regret that he is to be with them no more. In 1882 he went to Dakota where he resided until five years ago when he returned to this city and bought a 13-acre farm in East China which has been his home. He also owns a large farm at Cooperstown, N. D. He is very highly spoken of by those who knew him. The funeral was held from the house Tuesday afternoon and was conducted by Rev. J. G. Haller. The remains were interred in the Rose Hill cemetery.—St. Clair County Press.
