

## Hartell Discharged.

Chas. Hartell was exonerated of any intent to kill B. K. Climie, mention of whose death was given in last week's issue of the SENTINEL.

Mrs. Climie testified that Hartell and Climie had been on the best of terms and that she was positive that Hartell was innocent. Mrs. Climie had not been feeling well and had expressed the wish that they kill a prairie chicken for her, and while Ben was mowing he discovered a covey of chickens and called to Hartell to bring the gun and shoot one, which Hartell started to do. He was following along behind Climie as he mowed around to where the chickens were, when the gun was accidentally discharged, the charge striking Ben in the back near the heart. He died almost instantly without speaking.

The funeral was held at Dickinson at 9 o'clock last Friday morning and interment made at that place.

Mrs. Climie is expected here as soon as Ben's affairs can be adjusted. She has the deep sympathy of everyone in her sorrowful old age. Besides his mother the deceased leaves a little son four or five years old to grow to manhood without the care of father or mother. The grandmother is old and feeble and at best cannot live but a few years.
