

Died of Heart Failure.

Martin Johnson, an old settler of the town of Romness, was found dead out in his pasture last Thursday.

He had gone out in the morning to drive the cattle home and as he did not return a searching party was formed and the body found during the afternoon. He had apparently been stricken with heart failure and fell over dead.

Deceased was unmarried and about fifty-five or sixty years of age. He had lived alone until recently when he had rented his farm.

LATER—We learn that Mr. Johnson was sixty-five years old and that he had three brothers, Ole Johnson and John Elsaas, both of Romness, and Haagen Johnson of South Bend, Wash. The funeral was held last Saturday from the residence, Rev. Boe, of Finley officiating, and burial was made in the Ottawa cemetery.
