

Two Men Killed by Lightning

Carl Weiland, a well known farmer who lived about seven miles east of Dazey, and an employe named Amand Trebert, were killed by lightning Monday evening. Mr. Weiland, Mr. Trebert and another employe named August Kunzie were sitting in the door of the barn while a shower was passing over. With them were three of Mr. Weiland's children. The youngest, a boy, was in Mr. Weiland's lap and the two girls were sitting between the men. Lightning struck the wind mill, which was near by, passing down through the barn, and instantly killing Mr. Weiland and Mr. Trebert. Mr. Kunze and the two girls were slightly shocked, while the little boy escaped without any injury whatever. John Weiland, a brother of Carl, was near by and did his best to revive the two men, but they were beyond human aid.

Carl Weiland was popular and well liked by his neighbors and was a good citizen in every sense of the word. He leaves a widow and family of children who have the sympathy of the entire community. Mr. Trebert was a brother of Mrs. Julius Jahn of this city. He was a steady and reliable young man, well liked by his associates. The funeral of Mr. Weiland took place at 10 o'clock Wednesday morning from St. Mary's church. Mr. Trebert's funeral was from St. Catherine's church in this city this morning.—
