

# LUNDE-WESTLEY WEDDING

Two Popular Griggs County Young People Married on Wednesday of Last Week.



The marriage of Miss Olive Westley to Mr. Betuel M. Lunde took place on June 12, at 2:30 p. m., at the home of the groom's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Martin Lunde, the Rev. H. F. Josephson officiating in the presence of about one hundred of their relatives. To the music of Lohengrin's wedding march the young couple accompanied by Miss Carn Lunde, a sister of the groom as bridesmaid and Mr. Martin Westley, a brother of the bride as best man, together with a train of near relatives, marched from the house to the little circle of cherry trees on the lawn where the vows were spoken.

Seats had been arranged and a lunch was served in the open after the showers of congratulations subsided. A band consisting of nine very near relatives led by the groom himself, helped to entertain, and also an orchestra and special numbers of both instrumental and vocal music and games, so there was not a dull minute.

At 6:30 the curtains were drawn and the new gas lights lit up the splendid tables decorated with roses, canations, lilies and snowballs with a smilax line round about and the wedding dinner (by the way as splendid a dinner as was ever tendered Griggs county people) lasted until 12 o'clock.

The happy couple were the recipients of many useful and ornamental presents which will help to commemorate this occasion. The weather could not have been more perfect and all agree that this was one of the most beautiful weddings ever witnessed. The bride was dressed in white messaline silk with veil fastened with a wreath of lilies of the valley. She carried a large bouquet of white roses. The bride is the eldest daughter of Mr. and Mrs. O. M. Westley of the Hannaford State bank (we might add that these parents were among the first to celebrate marriage in Griggs county) and is a young lady worth knowing and has a host of friends wherever she is known.
