

A FARMERS' INSTITUTE

Cooperstown to Have a Session on
Monday, March 20th—In After-
noon and Evening.

Through the efforts of the Commercial Club, a farmers' institute will be held in Cooperstown on the afternoon and evening of March 20, 1911. The afternoon session will begin at 1:30 and last until 4:00. The evening session will be from 7:30 to 9:00. No special program will be prepared in advance. Hoverstad, who will be in charge of the institute will be assisted by Col. R. A. Wilkinson of Lake Elmo, Minn. Col. Wilkinson is one of the early settlers of the Red River Valley. His first farming operations were grain growing. Later he developed one of the largest live stock farms in the Red River Valley. His specialty is dairying. His herd contains many dairy animals of superior excellence. Others from the Agricultural college will be present and address the meeting. Be sure to be on time.
