Annual Meeting of Stockholders was Held

Dr. J. A. H. Winsloe was elected superintendent of the speed department and of the grounds. The time set for the fair is June 28, 29, 30. There will be no race meet at Carrington, Courtenay and other towns that were in the circuit last year so that it is figured out that Cooperstown ought to have a winning fair and race meet this year. The meeting Monday was a very enthusiastic one and everybody is right in line to boost the fair early and late. It is proposed to

have numerous attractions and the people will get a run for their money. The poor crop of last year has not stopped the boosters for a minute and the fair of 1911 will eclipse all previous efforts.
