

Electric Lights Again.

A special meeting of the Commercial Club was held Monday evening to discuss the matter of electric lights and it was well attended, the main idea being to form a local stock company.

E. H. Ackerman, a salesman for an implement firm, who is a practical electrician, was present and discussed the proposition and offered to take a thousand dollars worth of stock with the understanding that he was to be given the preference as manager of the institution.

A committee consisting of John Syverson, H. P. Hammer and J. L. Houghton was appointed to solicit shares and see what could be done in the way of incorporating.

This is probably as good an opportunity as Coconino will ever have to get an electric plant and get it right, and we hope that it may be carried through.

In connection with the light proposition was one from Chester Piatt to dam the Shoyean river and furnish power for the plant. Mr. Piatt has investigated the matter thoroughly and has concluded that he can dam the river to such good advantage that it will develop, with the proper water wheels, fully 150 horse power.
