OFFICIAL PUBLICATION.

Board of County Commissioners met in regular session this 3rd day of April 1905.

Present—Lucken, Nelson, Hadlock and Johnson.

Minutes of proceeding meeting read and approved.

On motion the surety bond of R. M. Cowen, as County Auditor, in the amount of \$5,000.00 was accepted.

Bids from the State Bank of Binford, the State Bank of Cooperstown, First National Bank of Cooperstown, Griggs County State Bank and the Hannaford State Bank for time deposit certificates then opened and discussed.

On motion made and carried the county treasurer was instructed to deposit three thousand dollars on one year's time certificates in each of the following five banks at 3 per cent interest:

The State Bank of Binford, the State Bank of Cooperstown, First National Bank of Cooperstown, Griggs County State Bank and the Hannaford State Bank.

Bids for stationery from the Binford Times, The Sentinel and the Courier were then opened and laid over for further consideration.

On motion carried the treasurer was authorized to pay the Griggs County Fair Association the amount due them April 1, 1905.

On motion carried authority was granted to pay by auditor's warrant \$30 to the treasurer of Bryan township, the amount having been appropriated to that township for bridge material at the July, 1904, meeting.

On motion carried the county surveyor was instructed to survey road on section line between sections 9 and 16, twp 144, range 60, and submit report. The county auditor to advertise for bids for grading required.

On motion carried \$11.39 was refunded to Ole Skratfoss, town of Tyrol assessed for year 1904, on property which did not belong to him.

On motion carried Board adjourned to meet at 9 a. m.

On motion carried Commission Johnson was authorized to purchase material and repair bridge between sections 22 and 23, in town of Pilot Mound.

On motion carried the county surveyor was instructed to locate and submit reports on the following three proposed bridges:

1. Across Bald Hill creek on north line of section 5, town of Greenfield.
2. Between sections 3 and 4, town of Tyrol.
3. Across Bald Hill creek, between range line 60 and 61, township 146.

The Auditor to advertise for bids for the construction of the above 3 bridges.

On motion carried the bid of P. R. Trubshaw for furnishing stationery was accepted.

On motion Board adjourned to meet at 2 p. m., April 4.
