On motion it was ordered that the personal property taxes of the Cargill Elevator Co. at Hannaford for the year 1905 be abated, account double assessment.

On motion John Ebentire was appointed road overseer for the 2nd District.

On motion the school poll tax assessed against Oswald Melgard for 1905 was abated, account he being too young.

On motion the taxes against lots 20 and 21, block 17, in Cooperstown, for 1905, were abated on a valuation of \$100, for the reason that this amount was assessed for structures, there being no structures on the lots April 1, 1905.

On motion the auditor was directed to assign the county's interest in lots 14 and 15, block 51 in Cooperstown, to Walter Lewis, on payment of the sum of \$53.00.

On motion the 1905 personal property taxes of Iver L. Skaar in Dover Twp, were abated on a valuation of \$250.00 for the reason that the assessment was unequal and unjust.

Bids for furnishing the county with stationery for the coming year were received from H. S. Rearick and P. R. Truhshaw. A motion was made and carried accepting the bid of P. R. Truhshaw.

A motion was passed granting permission to the Odd Fellows to use the Court Room on the evening of March 16th for their district meeting, on condition that they agree to leave the room orderly and clean.

The following resolution was duly passed by the Board:

Whereas, a petition has been presented by residents of the village of Binford, asking to be incorporated as a village under Chap. 29, Rev. Codes 1899, and

We, being satisfied that they have complied with the requirements of said law; be it

Resolved, that the territory embraced in said petition be and the same is hereby ordered, with the assent of the qualified voters who shall vote an said proposed incorporation on the 5th day of March, 1906, at Nelson's Hall in said village of Binford, to be included within the corporate limits of the incorporated village of Binford.

On motion the Board adjourned sine die.
