It was moved and carried that the Minneapolis Bridge & Iron Co. be awarded the contract for repairing the Sundeen bridge on Sec. 23, Washburn township for \$600.

It was moved and carried that the auditor be authorized to purchase a typewriter.

It was moved and carried that the auditor be instructed to write to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of each township calling their attention to the importance of carefully reviewing and equalizing the assessments, as required by law.
