

—The Rev. H. Styles Harriss of this place went to Rogers on Saturday to assist in the dedicatory services of the new M. E. church at that place on Sunday. It is his opinio that the people of Rogers appreciate the worth of a church in a community, both as to social and moral influence. Their church cost \$4,000. It will seat three hundred people in the main auditorium. It is artistically finised and furnished with every appliance and equipment requisite to effective work in that growing community. They have a basement the full length and breath of the church, which is 32x50 feet, that will be used for a reading room, lectures, for healthy amusements and for the practice of physical culture—in short it will be used for the intellectual, moral and social good of the young men and women of the community. The church has an incline floor and is heated by a furnace with hot air apparatus and lighted throughout with a gasoline plant. The people of Rogers deserve congratulations for the exercise of such good common sense in the erection of such a magnificent edifice for the worship of Almighty God. They most cordially responded to the call for subscriptions, individual subscriptions ranging from \$500 down. It was dedicated absolutely free of debt, all subscriptions being promptly paid in. The Rev. Kishpaugh, of Churches Ferry, preached the dedication sermon. The afternoon service was a platform meeting in which the Revs. Moore, Hewson and Harriss were the speakers. Rev. Burns preached at night. The Rev. Harriss accepted an invitation from the Rev. Hewson to visit Wimbleton and preach there to a large audience Sunday evening.
