

AN OLD CITIZEN DEAD

**Dr. N. A. Bergstrom Succumbs
to the Grim Reaper After Short
Illness.**

The people of the city were shocked to hear of the almost sudden death of Dr. Nils A. Bergstrom which occurred at his home in this city on Monday night at 10:30. The doctor had been sick for a few days, but did not think he was sick enough to go to bed until Monday when he took to his bed and died a few hours after. His death was caused from labored pneumonia.

He has studied medicine in Sweden and after selling out his drug business went back again to his native country and again took up the study of medicine. He came to Cooperstown in 1887 and has practiced medicine ever since he came here.
