

MRS. BRUNS DEAD.

The citizens of Cooperstown were greatly shocked to hear of the death of Mrs. J. W. Bruns which occurred at the farm home near Binford on Monday at a little after noon. She had contracted cold about two weeks ago and while she had been confined to her bed was considered getting better and felt cheerful and full of good spirits. She was stricken with a sudden attack of heart failure shortly before she died and passed away as stated, surrounded by her husband and other members of the family. Mrs. Bruns was a very quiet lady, devoted to her home and family and was and had been all her life a devout christian woman belonging to the German Lutheran church. She was fifty years old last October and married to Mr. Bruns 29 years ago and as a result of that marriage she leaves in an addition to her husband, two sons, Otto and Walter, and four daughters, Mrs. Boeckman, who lives on the farm, Mrs. Savre, of Hannaford, and Alma and Martha who live at home. The Bruns family came to Cooperstown in March 1904 and lived here two years since which time they have lived on the farm. The citizens of Cooperstown express sympathy for the bereaved family of children who have lost a kind and indulgent mother and to the sorrowing husband and father who has lost his life's helpmeet. The funeral will be held at the farm home Friday noon and interment will be made in the German Lutheran cemetery twelve miles northwest of Cooperstown.
