

MRS. LENHAM DEAD.

Mrs. E. W. Blackwell received word Monday of the death of Mrs. L. S. Lenham, which occurred last Friday at Chicago. Mrs. Lenham will be remembered by many friends in Cooperstown. She was formerly a resident of this state and lived for many years at Sanborn. She was taken sick a few days previous to her death, with grippe, which turned into congestion of the lungs. She died on Good Friday and was buried on Easter Sunday. She leaves four children—George L. Lenham of Buffalo, N. Y., Nathan L. Lenham and Mrs. Manley Davis, of Chicago, and Mrs. C. A. Mack of Oberon, N. D.

Mrs. Lenham was in her eightieth year and the burial which occurred on Easter morn was the closing chapter of a well rounded out life. The editor of this paper numbered Mrs. Lenham among his warmest friends when we lived at Sanborn twenty-five years ago. She was kind hearted and generous and the writer has spent many pleasant evenings under her hospitable roof.
