berg and yesterday they went to Mapleton to look at some land. They intended returning to Fargo on a

freight train which was due to reach Fargo at 8:45. When they reached the Mapleton station they found the train standing there just ready to puil out and they decided to get on the

front end and walk back to the caboose over the top of the train. Mr. Opfer was of an excitable nature and became alarmed that the train would pull out before they reached the caboose, and so they ran over the cars to the rear end. Shortly after they had reached the caboose and while sitting in it. Mr. Opfer suddenly pitched for-

ward, dead.

The body was brought to Fargo and taken to the Luger undertaking parlors where it was prepared for shipment. It was shipped to Waukon, Iowa over the Milwaukee road and interment will be made at Waukon.
