

Charles Rothert, one of the pioneer residents of the county, died at his farm home twelve miles northwest of this city at 6 a. m. Monday morning. The deceased had been in poor health for some time but no fatal results had been expected at this time. He died from Asthma-Emphysema from which he had been a sufferer for some time. The night previous he partook of his supper in the usual way and did not show any symptoms of failing. On the morning of his death he tried to get up but was so weak he could not make it and one of the family ran over to a neighbor's to call a doctor but he passed away before one could be summoned. He leaves quite a family and was 66 years old when he died. His wife was recently taken to the Jamestown asylum for treatment and is still there. Mr. Rothert was a good citizen and one of the substantial men of the county. The funeral was held at the farm yesterday afternoon and interment was made in the cemetery at that place.
