

J. J. Trubshaw, one of the oldest citizens of the parish, died at his home in Evangeline Sunday, Sept. 27, from the effects of a stroke of paralysis which he received on Thursday and never regained consciousness. He has been a resident of this parish for nineteen years and always took an active part in educational matters. For a number of years he was a teacher in the public schools. Although he was past seventy years of age he was very active up to the time he was stricken with paralysis and his death is mourned by a host of friends and acquaintances. The funeral services were held at Jennings, Tuesday.—Crowley, (La.) Signal.
