

A SAD DEATH.

The people of Cooperstown were greatly shocked Tuesday morning to hear that Mrs. I. D. Allen had died about eleven o'clock that morning. The night previous up to 9 o'clock she was evidently well as she had been visiting over the phone up to that time with Mrs. Rose. Later on in the evening an internal hemorrhage set in and despite the efforts of the doctors could not be stopped, and Mrs. Allen passed away next morning from loss of blood and exhaustion. The death of this estimable lady is indeed a hard blow to the bereft husband and the four little children who are left without a mother. On account of Mr. Allen getting ready to go away we are unable to get particulars of Mrs. Allen's life. The deceased was formerly Miss Nellie Meilke, of Glencoe, Minn., before she married Mr. Allen, and there her remains were taken Wednesday afternoon on the train for interment at the old home. She was married to Mr. I. D. Allen a few years ago and from that union four little children were born, three boys, and one little daughter only a few weeks old. Mrs. Allen was a splendid mother and a good wife and her loss to those who have been wont to lean upon her for help and succor is indeed a hard one. She was a woman of the home—a home builder—and was devoted to her husband and children. She numbered among her acquaintances many warm friends who deeply grieve over her passing away. The grief stricken family have the sincere sympathy of all their friends in this deep hour of sorrow.

Funeral services were held at the residence Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. J. Chas. Evans conducting the services. The floral offerings were beautiful. Mrs. C. J. Pryor and Mr. Henry Tony, of Glencoe, Minn., arrived Wednesday afternoon and accompanied the remains back to Glencoe.
