

Frederick Henry Nierenberg, oldest child of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Nierenberg, died in the hospital at Fargo on Thursday afternoon, August 29, from an operation for appendicitis. The young man was taken sick about ten days previous to his death. The day before his death he was taken to Fargo by Dr. Brimi, who had only been called into the case on that day. Dr. Brimi pronounced the case appendicitis and stated that the boy had an abscess which had broken. His condition he considered extremely critical and held out no hopes for his recovery but thought there might be a slim chance from an operation. After the surgeons had undertaken this operation it was discovered that the young man had perforation of the intestines and that his recovery was impossible. His parents were telephoned for and they made the ride to Fargo by auto during the early hours of Friday morning arriving at the bedside of their son about five o'clock. The boy was still alive and able to talk to his parents but soon commenced to fail and passed away about 2 o'clock in the afternoon. Fred was a little over twenty years old and was a bright young man of exceptionally good habits. His death is indeed a very heavy blow to his parents and the brother and sister who are left to mourn for his loved one who was so ruthlessly cut down in the days of his youth. The stricken family have the sincere sympathy of many friends. The funeral was held Saturday morning. A short service was held at the farm home five miles west of town and then the remains were escorted to the Lutheran church in this city and regular services held in the afternoon, Rev. J. C. Evans, pastor of the Congregational church, preaching the sermon. Interment was made in the Coopers-town cemetery.
