Spoooner (Wis.) Republican: G. V. Siegner, who died suddenly last Thursday of heart disease while in the Schubert restaurant, was one of Spoooner's oldest and best known citizens.

The deceased was born in New Hampshire, Canada, March 3rd, 1857, aged 55 years, 9 months, 11 days.

He was married to Rachel Hammer Jan. 7th, 1887, at Valley City, N. D. To them two children were born a son and daughter, the daughter having preceded him to that other and better world, from which no traveler returns.

Mr. Selgner came to Spoooner with his family in 1894, from Harlem, N. D., when Spoooner was but a small place. He invested quite extensively in land, which, as the town expanded, rapidly, increased in value until today his holdings are very valuable. He also conducted a general merchandise business, which was one of the oldest and largest in the city. At the time of his death he was the largest taxpayer in the city. In business affairs he was always prompt in meeting his obligations and expected the same of others with whom he dealt. He had the largest store in the city and took great pride in keeping it up to date, both as to appearance and stock.

The funeral was held Sunday afternoon at two o'clock at the Dr. Cox Rev. E. M. Taylor conducting the services. Burial took place in the Spoooner cemetery and the remains laid to rest in the family lot.
