RASMUS WAGLEY DEAD

Popular Mail Carrier on Rural Route No. 3 Passed Away Tuesday Morning at 7:30.

It is with genuine regret that the Courier is obliged this week to chronicle the death of Rasmus Wagley, whose demise occurred at the Platou Hospital, Valley City, at 7:30 Tuesday morning of this week. Mr. Wagley was operated upon for appendicitis and perforation of the bowel four weeks ago, and for a couple of weeks or more he gained and it was thought tht he would recover. Several days ago however, he commenced to fail and died as stated above. The deceased about two years has been a valued and much appreciated servant of the government, being employed to car-ry the mail on Rural Route No. 3. Josephson being the officiating clergyman. The funeral will be held in the Westley church south of town where interment will be made. The deceased was the oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. M. R. Wagley of this ciyt, and they with the other members of the family have the sympathy- of their friends in this hour of deep bereavement.
