

THE LATE MRS. ZIMMERMAN.

B. B. Brown has received a letter from Ormonde, Florida, giving a few details concerning the sickness and death of Mrs. M. Zimmerman. It appears that she died within a few minutes. She was lying on a lounge playing with her little granddaughter and suddenly complained of a pain in her chest and died almost immediately without any previous sickness. She was buried last Thursday afternoon. Mrs. Zimmerman was 69 years old. She was a sister of J. N. and B. B. Brown, of this city. She was one of the best women that ever lived, kind hearted, generous and loving. For many years in the early history of Cooperstown she lived in the then little village and later moved onto the farm two and a half miles south of town, later moving to Florida a few years ago. While a resident of this city she was identified with the church and social interests of the community taking an active part until she moved out of town. She made a large list of friends, especially among the old timers, who cherish her friendship and regret her removal from the scenes of earthly life. She was a Christian woman and one of the first members of the Congregational church of this city.
