

## —He Made It Pay Big.

K. H. Brunskill, came from Iowa county, Wisconsin, 1882, with property and accounts worth about \$11,500. Now owns 3,200 acres of land, 1,000 acres under cultivation, buildings worth \$2,000, and the farm worth about \$15 per acre. He has 23 horses and 15 cattle. Last year's crops were: 22,375 bushels of wheat from 750 acres, 3,400 bushels of oats from 80 acres, 500 bushels of potatoes from 2 acres, and 40 tons of millet and Hungarian from 20 acres. He says: "I have never raised any cattle to sell—only a few to supply the wants of the farm. Have raised a few horses every year, and consider it a paying business, as it costs very little more to raise a horse than a steer, and good, heavy horses are always in demand and at good prices. I think they are more profitable than cattle."
