

## Has Done Well.

P. T. Duncan, of Sharon, was born in Scotland, but raised in Dodge Co., Wisconsin. Came to Dakota in 1882. Worked at the carpenter trade three years. In the spring of 1886 came to Steele county, with three horses and one cow and settled in Norman township. Has done well. He now owns the south half of section 20, has 120 acres under cultivation and 150 acres enclosed for pasture. Raised 3200 bushels of grain last year. Has at the present time 9 head of horses and colts, 10 head of cattle, some sheep and hogs. He has a pretty location with good comfortable buildings. A postoffice established at his place, with mail twice a week. He finds diversified farming pays the best. Sharon some day will be noted as a railroad center, as the Hope branch has been surveyed there, and the Fargo, Sherbrooke and Devils Lake line survey crosses the Hope line there. It also is on an air line between Jamestown and Grand Forks. We are informed by good authority ere long a line will be run from Valley City to Regina on the Canadian Pacific. Sharon is in it. With such railroad facilities the time is not far distant when Sharon will be the county seat of Steele county.
