-J. B. Honeyman, the boss gardener of the county, sent down by the mail carrier Thursday from his Sherbrooke garden another fine lot of vegetables. There were in this lot a sugar-beet weighing 934 pounds, 18 inches long, 17 inches in circumference; a rutabaga. weight 934 lbs., circumference 2334 inches: an Early Aberdeen yellow turnip, weight 10ths; four Carrots, 16 inches long, 11 inches in circumference; four parsnips, 80 inches long and 13 inches in circumference; two heads of cabbage, 86 inches in circumference. These regetables were all raised from the seeds, and matured in three months and twenty-two days. Can abyone beat this record? And can any climate and soil compare with that of North Dakota and Steele county in the way of productiveness? We are inclined to think that it cannot be beaten.
