

A Retrospection.

It is with regret that we are compelled to chronicle the fact that our town and county are gaining a very unsavory name of late. First, a number of years ago, a man by name of Bean, living in the southwestern part of the county, mysteriously disappeared, and it was almost the unanimous opinion of the people of the county that he was murdered.
