—By order of the board of county commissioner Sheriff Linn served papers upon L. A. Freeland last Monday on behalf of Steele county, to obtain possession of the Hope House. They base such action upon the complaint that L. A. Freeland has failed to pay rent for the property, and has thus violated his contract, and they also at their meeting declared the contract null and void. Just how the county expects to obtain possession from Mr. Freeland is not known, when the fact is known that Wamberg and Jacobson are already in possession by virtue of a writ from the court of Justice Wallace, the same having been issued after the time of limitation had expired in which Mr. Freeland could appeal from Justice Wallace court, and the writ served by the deputy sheriff and he having turned possession of the property over to Wamberg & Jacobson. We think that the majority of the tax payers of the county would be in favor of the county letting the matter rest until it is settled in the proper tribunal, the district court. These extra meetings and like proceedings cost money and the tax payers furnish that money.
