

Proceedings of Board of Trustees.

Office of Clerk of Town of Hope, 1

Hope, N. D., April 11th, 1892.

Meeting called to order at 7 p. m. by President C. J. Paul. Present Trustees Gilmore, Luce, Rice and King, and C. G. Merriell Clerk.

Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

The board then proceeded to examine the books, accounts and vouchers of Treasurer L. N. Wood, and had settlement with said Treasurer.

Moved and ordered that Sec. 7 of Ordinance No. 1 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows: "Sec. 7. Any person who shall by himself, his servants or agents, deposit the body or carcass of any dead animal, or the offal of slaughtered animals on any lands within the limits of said town and leave the same unburied, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall pay a fine of not more than ten dollars and costs of prosecution and in default of payment shall be committed to the county jail of Steele Co. N. D., or to such lock up as said town of Hope may provide, until such fine and costs be paid, or he be discharged by law, or order of the President of said board of Trustees." This amendment to take effect from and after its publication.

After considering numerous complaints upon the subject, the following ordinance was passed.

ORDINANCE NO. 5.

An ordinance to prevent the breeding, serving or trying, or the attempted breeding, serving or trying of any mare or Jenny ass within the platted limits of the town of Hope and to regulate the same elsewhere in said town, and to provide for punishment of the violation thereof.

Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, to breed, serve or try or to attempt to breed, serve or try any mare or Jenny Ass, or to assist in so doing, within the platted portion of the town of Hope. Provided that the same may be done elsewhere within the limits of said town if done within such an enclosure as will entirely conceal the same from public view, but not otherwise.

Sec. 2. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of ten dollars and the costs of prosecution.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after April 25th, 1892.

It was moved and ordered that a statement and exhibit of the receipts and expenditures of the town Treasurer be published in the Hope Pioneer.

Moved and ordered that the Clerk of the board give the notice required by law for the election of town officers to be held on May 2nd, 1892.

Moved and ordered that said election be held at the store of George A. Luce in Hope N. D., and that George A. Luce, Peter P. Rice and Laur King be the inspectors of said election. ;

Moved and ordered that this meeting be adjourned sine die.

; Upon examination of the record of the incorporation of the town of Hope and the subsequent proceedings it appears that there is no record of the division of said town into five districts.

Moved and ordered that the town of Hope be and the same is hereby divided into five districts, to-wit, that all that portion thereof lying east of Third street and north of Small avenue shall be the first district. All that portion lying north of Steele avenue, east of Second street and west of Third street shall be the second district. All that portion lying north of Steele avenue and west of Second street shall be the third district. All that portion lying south of Steele avenue and west of Third street shall be the fourth district, and all that portion lying east of Third street and south of Small avenue shall be the fifth district.
