

Meeting of the Board of Trustees.

The regular meeting of September 8th, 1890, was called to order by President Wasem at 8:35 p. m.

J. P. McMahon reported that he had secured a sale for town orders at the Steele County Bank.

J. P. McMahon reported concerning the matter of taxation, whereupon it was moved and carried that Arthur McLaughlin be engaged to go to Sherbrooke and aid the county auditor in extending the town tax upon the auditor's books.

On motion the fire-warden was directed to examine all buildings, lots, and enclosures, within the limits of Hope and discover if any of them are in a dangerous condition; to provide proper remedies for such and to regulate the manner of setting up stoves and stove-pipes.

On motion an ordinance was passed prohibiting the stacking of hay, straw, oats, wheat, flax, barley, or any other combustible within the corporate limits of Hope.

On motion the meeting adjourned at 10 o'clock.
