

Another Good Record.

Herbert Horner came to this county from Wisconsin in 1884, and took a homestead two miles northwest of Sherbrooke. The first summer he worked out by the month to get money with which to begin improvements on his farm. In 1887 he filed on a tree claim adjoining his homestead, so that he now has 320 acres, most of which is under cultivation. Last year from 105 acres of wheat the yield was 5,400 bushels, from 28 acres of oats 1700, 8 acres of barley 350 bushels, 1 acre of potatoes, 250 bushels. He has 12 horses and 10 head of cattle and farm machinery with which to carry on his farming. Mr. Horner has erected a fine barn on his farm and has a comfortable house. Mr. and Mrs. Horner have just returned from a visit to their old home in Wisconsin, which they left eight years ago, to seek a new one in what has proved to be the very best farming country America affords.
