
Says Stock Pays Well

David Long removed from Piper City, Illinois, in 1881 to Steele county and filed on a homestead where he at present lives in Bergen township. He afterward took a tree claim adjoining his homestead so that he now has 320 acres of choice farming land, which, together with his personal property consisting of 6 horses and mules and farm machinery he values at \$1,000. Mr. Long's last years crop was as follows: 2,680 bushels of oats and barley from 40 acres; 3,035 bushels of wheat from 120 acres and 300 bushels of potatoes from 13 acres. He says that stock pays well and that he intends going into that branch of farming more extensively than heretofore.
