

R. F. Pickert and B. Pickert were arrested on Tuesday on a warrant issued by Justice L. A. Jacobson charged by Eugene Grebler and David Dupont with assault with a dangerous weapon. The complainants allege that they were employed by R. F. Pickert, at Duluth, to work during the threshing season. They worked according to agreement for several days—a sufficient length of time to pay their railroad fare, which had been advanced by Pickert, when they notified him that they desired to quit his employ, alleging as a reason that they could not subsist on the food furnished. To this the Pickerts demurred, and on their demanding their clothing, etc., which the Pickerts held, the Pickerts ordered them to return to work, at the same time drawing revolvers and threatening to shoot them if they persisted in their attempt to leave. The accused appeared before Justice Jacobson and were released on their recognizance to appear for examination yesterday, but, perhaps owing to the storm, no appearance was made. The case will probably be heard to-morrow.
