

PROCEEDINGS

Of the Steele County Teachers' Association and Reading Circle, Held at Hope, Feb. 1st, 1890.

The meeting was called to order by Supt. Axdahl at 1:45 p. m. On account of so many teachers being absent from the county, and so much sickness, the attendance was small.

Supt. Axdahl read an instructive paper on the subject, "How to Secure Regular Attendance." This was followed by an excellent paper by Mr. Bemis, entitled, "First Lessons in Physiology."

This completed the programme and the society proceeded to the transaction of business.

The committee on drafting the constitution reported, and their report was accepted. The constitution reported by the committee was adopted, with certain exceptions.

The committee on selecting books for the reading circle reported, and recommended White's Elements of Pedagogy as the first book for study. The report of the committee was accepted and White's Elements of Pedagogy was adopted.
