

Meeting of Assessors.

At the meeting of the assessors of Steele county, held in Sherbrooke on the 11th day of May, 1899, Mr. A. T. Drakeley was on motion elected chairman, and L. C. Goylerud, secretary.

On motion the following schedule was adopted as a basis for the valuation of lands in the county for the purpose of assessment for the year 1899—not including improvements:

Newburgh, best prairie land \$7.00 per acre.

Eger, best prairie land \$6.50 per acre.

Primrose, Eden lake, Broadlawn and Hope, best prairie land, \$5.00 per acre.

Lincoln, best prairie land, \$5.50 per acre.

Colgate and Melrose, best prairie land, \$5.00 per acre.

All the balance of the county, best prairie lands, \$4.50 per acre.

On motion the following was made a basis for the assessment of personal property:

1st class work horses and mules not to exceed \$70.00.

1st class two year old colts not to exceed \$40.00.

1st class work oxen per yoke \$60.00.

1st class milch cows \$20.00.

Young cattle, stallions, jacks and bulls in the same proportion according to value.

Pigs at about \$2.00 per cwt.

Sheep, about \$2.50 per head.

Hinders used one season not to exceed \$50.

Steam threshers used one season not to exceed \$500.00

Wagons and carriages used one season not to exceed \$25.00.

All other property according to the judgment of the assessor.

On motion the meeting adjourned.
