

## Weather Report.

Monthly meteorological summary of the North and South Dakota weather service co-operating with the U. S. Weather Bureau of the department of Agriculture for July, 1891.

Temperature: Monthly mean, 66.4; highest monthly mean, 71.6 at Milbank; lowest monthly mean, 60.2; at Lakota; maximum, 96, at Oelrichs; minimum 34, at Flandreau; range for the states, 62; greatest local monthly range 60, at Grand Rapids; least local monthly range 37, at Parkston.

Precipitation: Monthly mean, 3.07, inches; greatest monthly, 7.64, inches at Wild Rico; least monthly, 0.45, of an inch, at St. Lawrence. The monthly mean temperature was about 4 degrees below the normal.

The North and South Dakota weather bureau is divided now and the central station for North Dakota is located at Bismarck, and this is the last combined report we expect to get. As you have a reporter in Hope, where he could get his report into the PIONEER the first issue in each month, more frequently than I can, I resign, and hope friend Leo Lang will furnish the weather report to the PIONEER hereafter.

Monthly summary for Riversdale, for August, 1891.

Temperature: Monthly mean, 65.2; highest daily mean, 79; lowest daily mean, 43; maximum, 98; minimum, 28; range, 70.

Precipitation: 0.88 of an inch.
