STRINGER -Mrs. Emma A. Stringer, wife of William J. Stringer, of Cooperstown, N. Dakota, died at their home, March 29, 1892. She was born at Orange, Michigan, April 23, 1867. She was the fourth child of J. H. and Sarah A. Van Dusen. Her religious training was such that at the age of ten years she was converted, joining the Methodist Episcopal church. She was ever afterward influenced by her remembrances, and closed her life in peace with her Savior. She, with her parents, emigrated to this country in October, 1882. On the first of November, 1887, she was united in marriage to her now bereaved husband, making their home at Cooperstown. She leaves two small children with the husband to mourn their loss. Her remains were brought to Hope for interment. The funeral was conducted by the writer—text: "I shall be satisfied when I wake with his likeness", Psalms 17-15. Sister Stringer had a bright, good christian experience in life, a happy spiritual experience in death, a brief sickness, and a quiet departure to the better world.
