Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., August 15th, 1891.

Board of county commissioners met at 10 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment. Present: Chairman Hanson and Commissioners Pease, Schjeldahl and Curry.

The minutes of the meeting of July 23rd and 24th were read and approved.

On motion it was ordered that the amount of \$1200.00 be levied for interest on county bonds and that the Auditor be instructed to extend same on the tax lists against all the real and personal property of the County for the current year.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from the general fund:

WHEREAS, a tax deed has been issued to Steele County, for the tax of 1887, of the rear 65 ft. of lot 21 and all of lots 22, 23 and 24, in block 24, in the original townsite of the town of Hope, Steele County, N. D.

THEREFORE, be it resolved, that the county Auditor and county Treasurer be instructed to procure an assignment of the tax sale certificate of said property, for the tax of 1888, and subsequent years, or, if said assignment cannot be procured, then, they are hereby instructed to redeem said property from said tax sale.

The bids for furnishing the County 25 tons of coal were opened and examined.

C R Jackson's bid, offering to furnish the coal laid down at Sherbrooke for \$10.00 per ton, being the lowest, on motion the same was accepted and contract awarded.

The application of John W Laramore for the purchase of lots 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 24, in block 5, in the original townsite of the village of Hope, was received and upon motion, the same was granted and a quit claim deed ordered issued to said John W Laramore, upon the payment into the county treasury of the sum of \$38.00 the price agreed upon.

Commissioners, Hanson and Pease, were, upon motion, appointed a committee for the purchase of election booths for the election of 1891.

Upon motion the board adjourned sine die.
