Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., February 20th, 1891.

Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to adjournment. Present: Chairman Hanson and Commissioners Day and Schjeldahl.

The minutes of the meeting of January 15th 1891, were read and approved.

Mr. G. H. Stavens appeared before the board and requested that his personal taxes for the year 1890, be reduced. After hearing the opinion of the States Attorney on the subject, all applications for reduction of taxes now before the board were, on motion, postponed indefinitely.
