Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D. June 13th 1891.

Board of County Commissioners met at 10 o'clock a. m. pursuant to adjournment.

Present: Chairman Hanson and Commissioners Day, Pease, Schjeldahl and Curry.

The minutes of the meeting of May 23rd were read and approved.

A petition was presented from a number of tax payers of Steele County, asking the Commissioners to offer a reward of one thousand dollars to the person or persons who shall bring to justice the murderer of Joseph H. Shaw.

On motion a reward of \$750. was offered for the apprehension and conviction of the person or persons who murdered said Joseph H. Shaw.

Ole C Erickson having deposited \$10. with the county treasurer, on motion an auctioneer's license was issued to said Ole C Erickson authorizing him to act as auctioneer in Steele County for one year from June 4th 1891.

On motion the bill of L. A. Jacobson for \$5. for arresting and attending Adolph Linke insane, was taken from the table and allowed.

On motion Wellington Van Dusen was awarded the contract for building the "Primrose Bridge" for the sum of \$45.

On motion Wellington Van Dusen was awarded the contract for moving the "old Mitchell Bridge" and re-building same in Sherbrooke Township for the sum of \$40:00.

On motion Ole J Colton was awarded the contract for building the "Norway bridge" for the sum of \$29.

The contracts for hauling the lumber were awarded as follows:

Lewis Thompson, hauling lumber from Hatton to "Norway bridge," for \$2 per M.

F R Rugg, hauling lumber from Hope to "Mitchell bridge," \$1 97 per M.

K Knutson, hauling lumber from Portland to "Primrose bridge" for \$1 40 per M.

On motion Merrill Eros. & Luco were awarded the contract for furnishing spikes and nails for all the bridges, in accordance with their bid.

On motion Mr. L C Day was appointed a committee to investigate and inspect the site for bridge applied for by Mr E D Wallace, between section 7 Edendale and section 12 Lincoln.

On motion Mr Hanson was appointed a committee of one to have charge of and superintend the building of the bridges.

After having stated our case to the Co. commissioners we were informed by them that their county farm, at the present time, was let out to a superintendent, and arrangement made with him in regard to their own poor, but as to taking in paupers from other counties, the Co commissioners would appoint a committee—which they did at their last meeting—to consult the said Supt of poor farm and see what he would be willing to do, and the commissioners, at their next meeting, would take some action on it, and immediately let us know.
