

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS

Of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, N. D., Oct. 3rd, 1892.

Board of county commissioners met in regular session at 10 o'clock a. m.

Present, Chairman Pease and Commissioners Curry, Schjeldahl, Williams and Day.

The minutes of the meeting of August 6th, 1892, were read and approved.

On motion salaries of County officials were allowed and ordered paid as follows:

Bids for furnishing coal were opened and examined. The bid of C. R. Jackson being the lowest on motion his bid, offering to furnish the county 25 tons of hard coal at \$11 45 per ton delivered, was accepted and contract awarded.

Mr W A Winslow tendered his resignation as Clerk of the District Court which resignation was, upon motion accepted.

On motion T S Hunt was appointed Clerk of the District Court to fill the unexpired term of W A Winslow, resigned.

On motion the County Auditor was ordered to publish in the official newspapers of the county a notice of the general election to be held in the County on the 8th day of November 1892, said election to be held at the polling places in the several election precincts in the county established by this Board on the 26th, day of September, 1891, except in the Township of Edendale, where the election will be held in the Township Hall in said township, and in the Township of Hope, where the election will be held in the school-house on section 26 in said township.

The following resolution was upon motion adopted:

Whereas, it appears that the chairman of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Hope is not a resident of said township and consequently cannot act as inspector of election of said township for the coming election. Therefore, be it resolved that Mr. Thomas Sussex be, and hereby is appointed Inspector of Election for said township of Hope.
