Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, October 6th, 1890.

Board of County Commissioners met in regular session at 10:30 o'clock a. m.

Present: Chairman Thompson, and Commissioners Hanson, Curry and Day.

The minutes of the meetings of August 12th and October 1st were read and approved.

On motion the salaries for the quarter ending Sept. 30th were allowed and ordered paid as follows:

S J Axdahl, Supt of schools,	50 00
P T Stankard, Janitor, Aug and Sept,	33 33

On motion the question of increasing the jurisdiction of the county court was ordered submitted to a vote of the electors of the county at the general election to be held November 4th, 1890.

On motion the bill of S. J. Axdahl for \$176.80 for per diem and mileage, months of August and September, was allowed at 161.80. Balance not paid on account of notices not being received.

On motion the following bills were allowed and ordered paid from the general funds:

On motion the board adjourned till 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at 1:30 o'clock p. m. Present: All members.

S J. Axdahl, cash advanced for postage, stationery and freight, \$2.63.

On motion the county Treasurer was instructed to proceed to issue tax deeds for all lands and town lots sold to Steele County for taxes of 1886 and 1887, at tax sales of 1887 and 1888.

On motion the statement and affidavit of E. D. Wallace in regard to his assessment was laid on the table.

Moved and ordered that that part of the motion for fixing polling places, passed at last meeting of commissioners relating to Hope election precinct be considered.

Moved and ordered that the election in Hope election precinct be held in the Arcade building Cor. 3rd St. and Steele Ave. in the village of Hope.

On motion Messrs. Gunder Rud and R. O. Lovly were appointed appraisers for the purpose of appraising an stray heifer taken up by John E. B. thun of Eger, Township.

On motion the official bond of S. J. Axdahl, Superintendent of schools was approved and accepted.

The report of H. B. Thomas, Justice of the Peace was referred to the States Attorney.

The States Attorney rendered an opinion that Mr. Thomas was not a qualified justice at the time of the action referred to in said report, and on motion the report was rejected.

On motion the bill of Bugbee Bros. for hauling lime, cement, stone, sand and lumber for vault, \$210.75, was allowed and ordered paid.

On motion the board adjourned to Saturday, Oct. 25th, at 10 o'clock a. m.
