

**OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS****Of the Board of County Commissioners.**

Sherbrooke, N. D., Sept. 26th, 1891.

Board of County Commissioners convened in special session at 10 o'clock a. m. pursuant to call of county Auditor. Present: Chairman Hanson, and Commissioners, Pease, Curry and Schjeldahl.

The board proceeded to divide the County into election precincts and establish polling places in same, in accordance with the provisions of Sec. 7, Chap. 66, Laws of 1891, as follows.

Newburg civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 1, with polling place at the house of Sam Thompson, on Section 22 in said township.

Norway civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 2, with polling place at the school-house on Section 11 in said township.

Clifton civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 3, with polling place at the school-house on Section 10 in said township.

Norman civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 4, with polling place at the school-house on Section 20 in said township.

Bergen civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 5, with polling place at the school-house on Section 22 in said township.

Highland civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 6, with polling place at the school-house on Section 15 in said township.

Golden Lake civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 7, with polling place at the school house on Section 14 in said township.

Euger civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 8, with polling place at the township hall, on Section 15 in said township.

Priurose civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 9, with polling place at the school-house on Section 2 in said township.

Sherbrooke civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 10, with polling place at the school-house in the village of Sherbrooke.

Pickert civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 11, with the polling place at school house on Section 22 in said township.

Greenview civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 12, with polling place at the school-house on Section 8 in said township.

Riverside civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 13, with polling place at the school-house on Section 29 in said township.

Melrose civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 14, with polling place at the school house on Section 14 in said township.

Lincoln civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 15, with polling place at the school-house on Section 14 in said township.

Edendale civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 16, with polling place at the school-house on Section 33 in said township.

Broadlawn civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 17, with polling place at the school-house on Section 18 in said township.

Colgate civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 18, with polling place at the school-house on Section 29 in said township.

Hope civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 19, with polling place at the house of H. D. Carpenter, on Section 2 in said township.

Willow Lake civil township shall constitute election precinct No. 20, with polling place at the school-house on Section 29 in said township.

The incorporated town of Hope shall constitute election precinct No. 21, with polling place at the public school-house in said town.

On motion an election was ordered held in the several election precincts in the First and Fourth Commissioner Districts, for the election of one County Commissioner for each of said districts, on the 3rd day of November, 1891.

On motion the board adjourned until 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Board re-convened at 1:30 o'clock p. m. Present: All members.
