Proceedings of the Board of County Commissioners.

Sherbrooke, Oct. 23th, 1890.

Board of County Commissioners met at 10 o'clock a. m., pursuant to adjournment.

Present: Commissioners Hanson, Pease and Day. On motion Mr. Hanson was elected chairman pro tem.

On motion Mr. John Tomlinson was authorized to convey Mr. Fred Harland's child to Yostland, Michigan, at a cost to the county of not to exceed \$50.

On motion the board adjourned till 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Board reconvened at 1:30 o'clock p. m.

Present; Commissioners Hanson, Pease, Day and Curry. Mr. Hanson in the chair.

The bids for furnishing the county 30 tons of coal and coal oil for the year, delivered at Sherbrooke, were opened and examined.

The bid of C. R. Jackson for furnishing 20 tons of coal at \$9 95 per ton being the lowest on motion the same was accepted and contract awarded.

The bid of L. N. Wood & Co. for furnishing the county with coal oil for the year for 17c per gallon, being the lowest, on motion the same was accepted and contract awarded.

On motion the contract for publishing the delinquent tax list was awarded to the Hope Pioneer at 8c per description. A bond of \$500 to be furnished for the faithful performance of the same.

On motion the County Auditor was directed to give a notice of the sale of all real property on which the taxes for the year 1889 have not been paid, and cause the same to be published in the Hope Pioneer, for a period of three weeks commencing the first week in November.

Moved and ordered that Mr. P. T. Stankard be appointed jailor for the county, beginning for a year, commencing Nov. 1st, 1890, at a salary of \$20 00 per month, for the 6 months—November 1st to May 1st, and \$15.00 per month for the 6 months—May 1st to November 1st, 1891. On motion the board adjourned till Saturday, November 8th, 1890, at 10 o'clock a. m.
