

Thursday morning Paul Oppergard was instantly killed at Fargo in the N. P. yards where he was employed. On his way to work he attempted to get aboard a switch engine and ran in front of an approaching passenger train, failed to clear it and was caught by the beam which supports the cow-catcher, and thrown under the engine. He was horribly mangled before the engine could be stopped. His father, Hans Oppergard, of Dazey, was immediately notified of the sad accident and started for Fargo at once. He brought the remains home Friday and the funeral took place Saturday afternoon from his home in Dazey. Rev. Halling, of Valley City, conducted the funeral services. Almost the entire neighborhood turned out to the funeral. The bereaved parents have the sincere sympathy of the entire community. Paul was a steady young man of studious habits, well-liked by everybody and had very many friends. He was a student at the Agricultural college at Fargo, where he had attended several terms.
