The engineer did not miss him at the time and was not aware of the accident till the body was discovered by a bundle team. Dr. Nolte was immediately sent for and the body was brought to town and cared for by the M. W. A., of which he was a member. His parents, who live at Kellogg, Minn., were notified and Monday his brother arrived. Monday afternoon the body was taken to his former home, accompanied by his brother, Miss Ida Kjelson, and Miss Davis.
