

BOY KILLED

By a Freight Train at Kensal and Head Severed From Body.

Jamestown Capital: Harry Smith, aged 17, was killed by a freight train in Kensal about 11 a. m. Saturday. The train was backing up on the main track to make a switch, and running at considerable speed, when the young man stepped onto the track from between the coal chute and coal dock. The elevator was running and drowned all noise from the approaching train and without warning he was struck by the caboose, thrown across the tails and the wheels of four cars passed over his body, from which the head was entirely severed, and the face horribly mutilated.

The remains of the boy were taken to the undertaking establishment of C. D. Clifford, by order of Justice E. B. Wolff, and his father and brother, who were working with a threshing crew near Carrington, notified. His mother is visiting friends several miles in the country near Oberon, and has not yet been found. The case is a particularly sad one, as family troubles a few years ago resulted in the separation of Mr. and Mrs. Smith.
