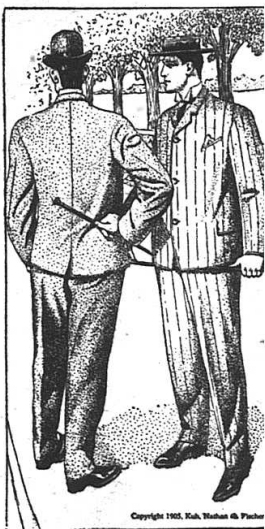


GEORGE SPANGENBERG DEAD.
