

A SUDDEN DEATH.

The people of Wimbledon and vicinity were shocked Monday evening when the news quickly passed around that Frank Treitlin, one of the early settlers here, died suddenly of heart failure about six o'clock that evening, at the age of 72 years. The old gentleman apparently been enjoying good health up to, and within a few minutes of his death. He was sitting in a chair and conversing with members of the family who were engaged at preparing the evening meal, when his heart ceased to beat and he fell to the floor dead. The deceased was born in Hockheim Baden Germany, Feb 9th 1831, He came to America about 50 years ago, filed on a homestead in Illinois where he was married, from there he went to Wisconsin, was a soldier in the civil war, and in 1887 came to N. Dak. His wife and one daughter died here. two sons and six daughters still survive him. Funeral services were held from the German Reform church here Thursday at 1 p. m. Rev. Sandlerer and Hewson preaching the funeral sermon. The remains were followed to the cemetery by concourse of friends wished to pay their last respects to a departed citizen and soldier, for he was highly respected by all who ever chanced to meet him.
